


Greece needs sustainable and competitive mineral exploration and mining investiments (by Nikolaos Arvanitidis, Greece)

WISE - Widening Interdisciplinary Sustainability Education


A new EU - European Union granted project "WISE - Widening Interdisciplinary Sustainability Education" will start on 31st December 2015, and will be coordinated by the Collegium Civitas of Poland. WISE integrates four other European partners from Portugal, Greece, Sweden and Czech Republic. The aim of this project is to improve the Education for a Sustainable Development in Higher Education. The Portuguese team, coordinated by Clara Vasconcelos (co-coordinator of the IAPG-Portugal section - in the picture above), is responsible for an overview report on "Ecosystem Services, Geoethics and Biodiversity".

We remind you that geoethics is among the topics of another great European Project "ENVRI-Plus", just started (we gave you information with the IAPGeoethics Newsletter n. 3 - 2015). Silvia Peppoloni (IAPG Secretary General, in the picture on the right) is leading a Work Package (WP) titled "Developing an Ethical Framework for RIs" (RIs=Research Infrastructures), entirely dedicated to develop the ethical and social aspects of the project.
